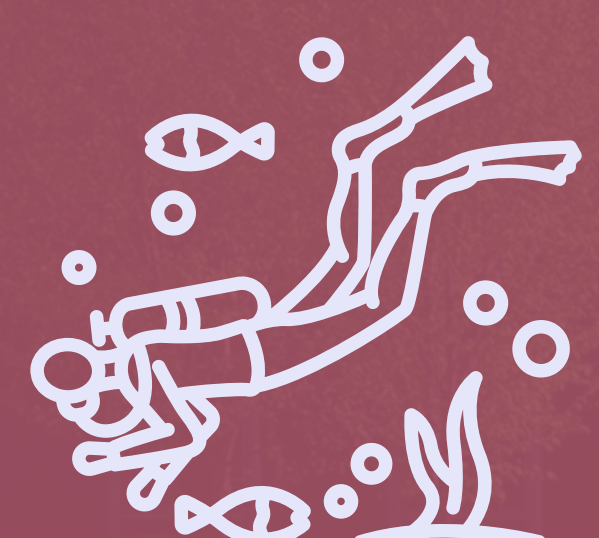
Prepare for Success

Dive into Course Election Priorities

Course priorities are designations used to prioritize enrollment during course election when more students elect a course than there are seats available. Departments and programs consider the intended audience for the course and set a ranked list of these designations. For example, an introductory course may prioritize first year students and sophomores, while advanced courses required for a major may prioritize senior and junior students who have declared that major.

Course priorities are only used for courses with enrollment limits during the course election period. Spring term has two course election periods, April 30 – May 8 for summer term and May 30 – June 4 for fall term. Students can view a courses' priorities on [DartHub](#) under "Course Enrollment Priorities" in the Undergraduate main menu.



Applications for a Transfer Term

Applications for a summer transfer term are due May 28th. The Dartmouth College transfer credit approval form, course syllabi from the other institution, and the other institution's academic calendar are all necessary to apply.
