## Advisor's Guide to Major/Minor Policies

## Important Major/Minor Policies

The <u>ORC/Cataloa</u> includes several policies concerning majors/minors. The below chart summarizes many of these policies for easy reference. **This is not an exhaustive list**, and advisors are encouraged to review the <u>ORC/Cataloa</u>.

Using a course towards multiple majors/minors	<ul> <li>A single course may not be used towards multiple majors/minors unless it is a prerequisite course to one or both majors/minors.</li> <li>If a student attempts to count a course towards multiple majors/minors, the <i>DartWorks Dashboard</i> displays an error message.</li> </ul>	Multiple Majors  The Minor
Multiple majors/ minors within a department/program	<ul> <li>Multiple majors may not be within the same department or program, except when a department offers separate and dissimilar majors, as approved by the COI.</li> <li>See the <u>list of invalid major/minor combinations</u>.</li> </ul>	Multiple Majors  The Minor
Culminating Experience	<ul> <li>The culminating experience must be taken for credit and graded.</li> <li>While departments/programs may make exceptions to their published major/minor requirements as they determine appropriate, an exception to the published major culminating experience must be approved by the Committee on Instruction.</li> <li>If a student requests an exception to the Culminating Experience, contact <a href="Registrar@Dartmouth.edu">Registrar@Dartmouth.edu</a> for petition instructions.</li> </ul>	Culminating Experience in the Major The Major
