Maps How-To Guide

This guide will walk you through the process of putting a Map on your iPod. The best thing you'll need is an iPod with photo capabilities. (It includes any iPod with a full color screen. iPod Nano and Shuffle don't have photo capabilities). You will also need to have iTunes. If you don't already have it, download it here.

1. Download the Map of your choice from the site and save the file somewhere that you can access it.
2. With your iPod connected, open up iTunes.
3. Click iTunes in iTunes, click the small iPod button in the bottom right corner of the window. It looks like this:

4. Click the tab labeled Maps.
5. Click the tab in the window labeled Photos.
6. Click the checkbox labeled Synchronize photos to select the folder in which you saved the file.
7. Click Choose Folder...
