SIIPC 2009 OBJECTIVES

- Identify promising theories and methods for providing patients with decision support in multiple-option / multiple-objective decision situations.
- Develop collaborative links among scientists who are prepared to investigate key theoretical and methodological research questions about patients’ decision support in multiple-option / multiple-objective decision situations.
- Anticipate emerging trends in the study of patients’ decision support in multiple-option / multiple-objective decision situations.

SIIPC 2009 FORMAT

- This will be an intensive methodological “retreat”.
- We will examine key cognitive theories about complex decision making, and consider the biases that can affect the decision support process.
- Leaders in the development of tools for patients’ decision support will outline their key methods’ underlying theories & procedural principles.
- Attending Fellows will adapt these methods to a particular complex decision situation, and will identify each method’s advantages and disadvantages.
- Attending Fellows will also have opportunities to present their own current work, to obtain mentorship, and to form collaborative links.
