

There are several courses usually offered in English in the Fall at Bocconi University that are pre-approved for transfer as Economics Major credit as follows:

May transfer as equivalents to Dartmouth courses:

May transfer as an unspecified major course, and may substitute in a sequence

5164 (same as 4367) Economics of the Firm	may substitute for 35 in the 25-35 or 25-35-45 sequence
5170 (same as 4374) European Labor Markets	may substitute for 74 in the 27-74 or 27-74-47 sequence
5104 Innovation and Industrial Dynamics	may substitute for 35 in the 25-35 or 25-35-45 sequence

May transfer as an unspecified major course, but is not part of a sequence

Note that there are other classes beyond those listed here being offered. However, many of them do not fit the liberal arts requirement of Dartmouth, and thus cannot be taken for credit (e.g. 5229 Management Consulting). Some others have strong prerequisites (e.g. 5118 Financial Mathematics), but if you have the required background you may be able to take the class and transfer it as an unspecified major course that is not part of a sequence. Thus, while we suggest you stick with the pre-approved courses listed here, other courses may be approved by the Vice Chair on an ad hoc basis.
