



Math 1-2 Vs. Math 3: Which Course is Best For You?

Math 1-2 is a two-course sequence offered by invitation only to students who might benefit from an integrated calculus and algebra sequence. Both courses are rigorous and demanding; both are staffed by terrific, committed instructors. Both will allow you to complete your quantitative distributive requirement in a single term. There are differences between the two programs, however, and the most significant include:

| <p>Math 1-2 is a two-term course offered only as a fall-winter sequence.</p> | <p>Math 3 is a one-term course offered in both fall and winter terms.</p> |
| <p>An extra term of Math permits you ample time to strengthen the algebraic skills needed to succeed at calculus.</p> | <p>Math 3 assumes that you have already mastered intermediate algebra and plane geometry.</p> |
| <p>Math 1-2 offers all of its students weekly study groups. Groups are led by specially trained upper class students who have earned at least an A- in Math 1-2 or a higher level Math course. Students may also request one-on-one tutorials with their study group leader.</p> | <p>Math 3 does not offer built-in tutor support. You can, however, find help through the Tutor Clearinghouse in the Academic Skills Center.</p> |
