

Department Guidelines for British A-level Work

Individual academic departments at Dartmouth view British A-Level work differently and should be contacted directly regarding credit and placement requests. In some cases, students who have achieved a grade of A on an A-Level examination may receive *specified credit in place of, not in addition to*, the general A-Level credit awarded. Various departments' guidelines are listed below:

Subject	Course Credit or Exemption
Chemistry	Students with an overall grade of A on the GCE A-Level Examinations (AS/A2) offered by one of the three English unitary awarding bodies (AQA, Edexcel, and OCR) will receive credit for Chemistry 5. Students who took A-Level Examinations offered by other awarding bodies should meet with the department chair or their representative at the beginning of Orientation week to determine if they will receive credit for Chemistry 5. Students who receive credit for Chemistry 5 are invited to take the Chemistry 6 credit test at the end of Orientation week.
Economics	Credit for Economics 1.
French Language A	Consult department chair; invitation to take Dartmouth Advanced Reading Test (DART) for possible French 10 credit.
Language B	Consult department chair; invitation to take Dartmouth Advanced Reading Test (DART) for possible French 10 credit and the Advanced Proficiency Exam (APE) for possible French 8 exemption.
Mathematics	Exemption from Math 3; invitation to take department test for possible Math credit (in place of unspecified credit).
Physics	For a grade of A, credit for Physics 3 and 4; for a grade of B, one unspecified credit.
Spanish: Literature	Exemption from foreign language requirement and Spanish 9 credit.
Spanish: Language	Exemption from foreign language requirement.
Statistics	Credit for Math 10.
