### DRFC CLINCHES #11 SEED IN NATIONAL TOURNAMENT

Over the weekend of November 12th and 13th, the Dartmouth Rugby Football Club was the runner-up in the Northeast Championship, clinching a spot in the National Championship to be held this spring. Dartmouth Rugby faced Army in the Northeast Championship Final on Sunday after winning the quarterfinal against the University of Buffalo Saturday afternoon in Amherst Massachusetts. ## DEDICATION CONTINUED

The facility is surrounded by Battle practice field and the Brophy pitch which will be home to some of the most meaningful and competitive rugby in the Northeastern Rugby Union for years to come.

The facility was dedicated on Friday, September 23rd, as Trustee and former Dartmouth rucker Michael Chu '68 accepted the facility on behalf of the College. The formal acceptance of the facility was followed by a few words from College President James Wright who praised Dartmouth Rugby for their winning tradition. Other notable speakers included James N. Perkins '55, a close personal friend to Corey Ford, and former player and coach Wayne Young '72. The evening celebrated many great alumni who contributed to this great leap forward in the stature of the club—especially Corey Ford, an esteemed writer who was a friend and coach to Dartmouth Rugby. Ford left his home to the club in his will as a means to find a permanent home for Dartmouth rugby and after years of work it is finally a reality.

On Saturday, the speeches and sentiments made way for a hard-fought game of rugby as Dartmouth faced off against perennial rivals and defending Northeast Champions, Army. The game inaugurated the beautiful Brophy field on a day befitting such a

tremendous occasion. The clubhouse and hills surrounding the pitch were engulfed with the screams of alumni, friends, parents, and students as over a thousand people appeared to appreciate this excellent showcase of rugby.

The game kicked off at three on a picturesque afternoon in Hanover and the men in green rose to the supreme challenge of competing with one of the best rugby sides in the nation.

The contest was extremely hard fought as the score at half time saw a tally of 13 – 13. In the second half, Army managed to build a 30 – 18 lead but with the urging of the crowd Dartmouth closed the deficit to 30 – 25. With time expired Dartmouth was knocking on the door of the Army try zone but was unable to punch it in for the match—ending the game as a heartbreaking loss.

While the game ended on a sour note, the team truly showed their salt. The Dartmouth ruggers truly embodied the tradition of success and fellowship that has been passed on through generations since the club's founding in 1951. Thanks to the generous gifts of friends and alumni the new facility will be host to more fierce competitions for years to come.

## NORTHEAST FINALS CONTINUED

In the match against Buffalo on Saturday, Dartmouth commanded the tempo of the game. An initial 12 - 0 lead was ultimately closed to 12 - 3 at half time. The second half was dominated by physical defense but punishing tackles and command of territory and possession allowed the men in green to make the score 17 - 3. In the closing minutes Buffalo managed to sneak in for a try making the final 17 - 10.

With only an evening's rest, the Championship match was held on Sunday afternoon in Amherst. Army came into the final match with a perfect record and the #1 seed in the Northeast Rugby Union. Dartmouth came in as the #2 seed with a record of 8 - 1. Dartmouth's only previous blemish on their season record came in a 30 - 25 loss at the opening of the Corey Ford Rugby Clubhouse. The teams were set to clash yet again—this time it was for the title.

While Dartmouth had great momentum coming into the game, the men in green faced a strong Army side and ended up on the short side of a 37 - 7 score.

Dartmouth looked promising in the opening minutes as they managed to retain possession and drive deep into Army territory. But when Army managed to gain possession they capitalized on a fractured Dartmouth defense and found the try

zone. Despite continued Dartmouth offensive pressure, the Army defense remained a solid wall. The score was 20 - 0 at the half and Dartmouth went into the break still searching for a way to break the Army defense.

With the wind now at their backs, Dartmouth hoped to find more success in the second half against the Black Knights. However the half did not open in favor of Dartmouth, as Army found try zone early in the half. Another try later in the half made the score 30 - 0. With time running out on Dartmouth's chances, wing Aziz Sayigh took the ball after a well run lineout got through the hands of the backline. Aziz found a seam in the Army line and was able to turn the corner on their back three making the score 30 - 7. In the closing minutes of the match, Army was able to come away with a try making the final 37 - 7.

While the Dartmouth men were disappointed with the loss, they were pleased to clinch the second Northeast seed in the 2006 Collegiate USA Rugby Championships. The runner-up trophy gives the men in green the #11 seed in the Round of Sixteen to be held this spring from April 21-23 in West Point, NY. Dartmouth will face the #6 seed Midwest champions Ohio State in the first round. Dartmouth faced the brawny Ohio State side while on April's spring tour, in a tough loss during the first round of the 2005 Cal Invitational Tournament in Berkeley, CA. The Dartmouth men certainly have a strong opponent in front of them—a fact that they will certainly be pondering over this blustery Hanover winter.

## Coach's Message

Dear Friends and fellow Alumni,

The fall 2005 has come to a rapid end, as we now are in the midst of preparing for Nationals and Ivies. Expectations are high, especially after the successes from last spring. In 2005, Captain Emeritus Erik Richardson and Co-Captain Emeritus Brad Hogate led a class group that returned the Ivy Cup to Hanover while also placing highly in the USA Rugby National Championships. More importantly, the 2005 senior class made the competitive process very enjoyable for the underclassmen and our coaching team.

This ethos has been inherited by a talented '06 senior class. Twenty-four seniors wore the green jersey this fall as they put their own mark on Dartmouth Rugby. Led by experienced Captains, a dedicated group of '07s and '08s, they made it no secret that they are setting out on a course to permanently return Dartmouth to the elite of American collegiate rugby. Building on their autumn successes, they have already committed themselves to fitness tests in preparation for the hard yards ahead this winter. As a staff, we look forward to finding ways to make their goals, in the Ivies and on the National Stage, a reality.

Our staff philosophy remains "player-centered growth: acquisition, development, and welfare":

1) **Welfare:** top priority is full medical coverage for our athletes. College-supplied Athletic Trainer, Jeanne Wainscott, has done a great job helping the injured lads get back to full fitness over the years. Unfortunately, we only have the luxury of her services during the fall season, and only during home matches. It is imperative we find the means for a rugby trainer for the spring season as well as for away matches.

2) **Development:** the demands of the modern game require fit, multi-skilled athletes. This winter we will continue our focus of building greater aerobic and anaerobic thresholds via the weight-room, better footwork via SAQ drills, and, as always, better "thinking" rugby players via video analysis. Coach "Pete" Peterson continues to make in-roads with our scrum and phase play forward continuity. Coach Art Maerlander continues the development of our 1st year players, and effects of this are already showing (we had 25 '08s ready to compete for A/B side spots going into the fall season, and there are now 22 '09s ready to participate in A/B trainings this winter). Our next step is to establish a "mid-level" staff that solely focuses on our B-side group, as Coach Pete and I will look to work more hands on with the top 35 or so A-side guys and Coach Art on the development squad. Helping us in this endeavor are Coaches Fred Redden, John Turner '04, and Omar Foda '07. We are continually evaluating these development processes, yet our basis remains rugby fundamentals, fitness, and a positive team culture.

3) **Acquisition:** Participation is up, and there is a good buzz in the community about rugby. Our efforts over the last couple of years to sell rugby as a "legitimate sport for legitimate athletes" is also beginning to show positive effects when coupled with the permanency of the clubhouse. Football, lacrosse, and soccer players are once again playing for the DRFC in their "off-season," and the profile of our sport continues to grow on campus, in publications, and within the administration. In addition, we continue our off-campus recruiting efforts,

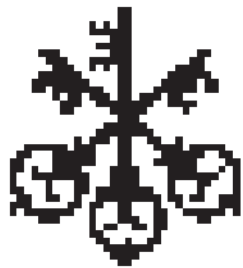
