"Living between the Cracks" – focus group interviews with sometime users of the Second Harvest food banks in selected locations in New Hampshire, Michigan, and Arkansas and survey construction. First phase completed Summer 2004. Second phase, including survey distribution and preliminary analyses, completed Winter 2005.

GRANT WRITING

"Project LISTEN" with Dr. Rowland Hazard at the Spine Center, Dartmouth Mary Hitchcock Center – focus groups and in-depth interviews with patients suffering with lower back pain to understand the psychosocial influences which may lead to disability.
