

## MAJOR IN PSYCHOLOGY

### Prerequisites

- \_\_\_ PSYC 1
- \_\_\_ PSYC 10 (or equivalent)

Students must obtain a grade no lower than C in PSYC 1. Students who fail to obtain a C or better may still complete a major in Psychology in the event that they earn C or better in their next two PSYC courses. PSYC 10 may be taken concurrently with PSYC 1.

### Requirements

Eight courses including the following:

- \_\_\_ PSYC 11 (may *not* be taken concurrently with PSYC 10)
- \_\_\_ At least two must be numbered in the 20s: one must come from the set PSYC 22, 23, 24, or 25; the other must come from the set PSYC 21, 26, or 28.
- \_\_\_ One of which is numbered in the 50's or higher\*
- \_\_\_ One of which is numbered in the 60's or higher\* (this requirement constitutes the Culminating Experience requirement in Psychology)
- \_\_\_ Three additional PSYC courses

### **\*NOTES:**

1. Transfer courses may not be used to satisfy these requirements. No more than 2 courses may, with prior approval, be transferred.
2. Neither PSYC 88 (Independent Research) nor PSYC 89 (Honors Research) may be used to satisfy the 60 or higher requirement.
3. Students who elect PSYC 88 (Independent Research) and/or PSYC 89 (Honors Research) may count no more than two terms of enrollment in these courses toward the eight required electives for the major. Additional terms may be taken, however, and these do contribute to satisfying the College course count required for graduation.
4. *With prior approval*, a course from another department may be used as an elective, if it is relevant to the student's program of study.
