## JANE LEMIRE

assistant director of financial operations, Dartmouth Athletics and Recreation

**ON THE JOB:** Lemire, of West Lebanon, N.H., has been at Dartmouth for 20 years. She is responsible for financial planning and travel coordination for Dartmouth's 34 varsity athletic teams and oversees the payroll process for all positions in the department. "There are a lot of challenges," she says. "But it's all actually fun. The positive energy of our coaches and staff makes it really worthwhile."

**NO EXCUSES:** Lemire works at a desk, but she's also a longtime athlete. "I'm a runner—I compete in half marathons. On a typical day I'll run 5 or 6 miles at lunch. If the weather isn't cooperating I'll hop on a treadmill upstairs. I have no excuse not to!" she says.

**REACHING OUT:** Twelve years ago, Lemire's mother, Nancy Parisi, was diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease at age 62. "There were not a lot of services or information available then. I knew I needed to do something," she says. In addition to her community efforts—Lemire's "TeamAlzheimer's" runs the Covered Bridges Half Marathon in Vermont for local charities each year—she has become a resource for those at Dartmouth coping with similar issues. Lemire leads an informal Caregivers of Aging Parents support group, and collaborates with Human Resources to provide employee workshops on elder care (see sidebar at right).

**LESSONS:** "What I found out 12 years ago is how many other people were struggling and didn't know where to go," she says, noting that caring for someone with Alzheimer's is emotionally challenging. "I've met a lot of different people, but so many of their experiences are the same. My advice is that it's OK to reach out, to get involved and take advantage of what is out there."
