Hello student employers,

Effective March 19, 2023, the hourly minimum wage for Dartmouth non-union student employees will increase from \$11.50/hour to \$16.25/hour.

## What employers need to do:

- Use the updated <u>Recommended Student Hourly Rate Structure & Guidelines for Student</u> <u>Wage</u> document (pdf) to assess what hourly pay rate is most appropriate for each of your student jobs.
  - SEO will update all pay rates currently <u>below</u> the minimum so that they are \$16.25/hour in JobX by mid- to late-March.
  - Employers who wish to make other changes to their pay rates should enter the edits in JobX as soon as they can. <u>Instructions on how to edit a job's details in JobX are</u> <u>online</u> (pdf). Complete all four steps and ensure that your updated job is sent to Pending Approval Status for review by the Student Employment Office (SEO).

#### FAQs about this change:

We have developed a short list of <u>employer and student employee FAOs</u>, which we will continue to update as we develop more information.

#### Notifying student employees:

Within the next few minutes, we'll send an email notice to all students who have worked in an hourly-paid student job this academic year. Please feel free to share this information with your student employees directly if you wish.
