



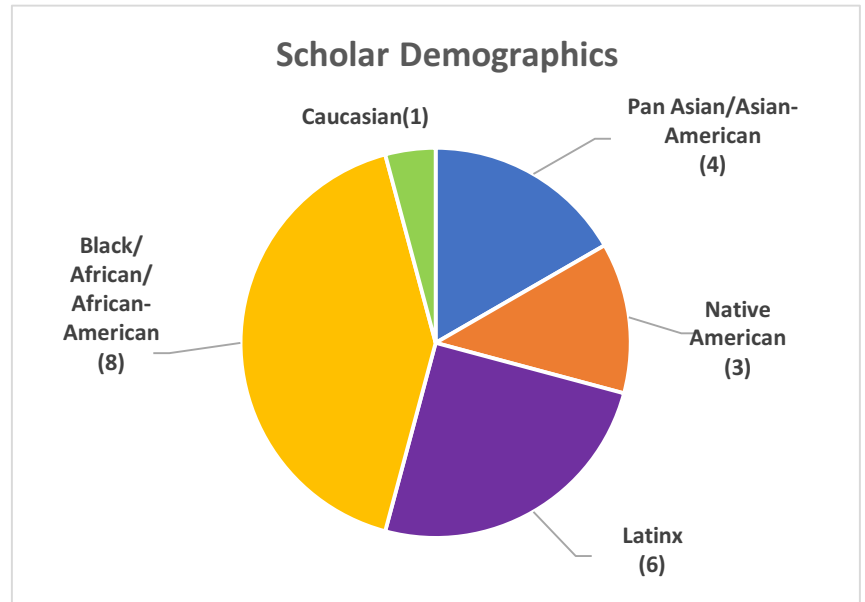
Pathways Scholars Program An Initiative of The Health Professions Program
