Important Major/Minor Policies

The <u>ORC/Cataloa</u> includes several policies concerning majors/minors. The below chart summarizes many of these policies for easy reference. **This is not an exhaustive list**, and advisors are encouraged to review the <u>ORC/Cataloa</u>.

Using a course towards multiple majors/minors	 A single course may not be used towards multiple majors/minors unless it is a prerequisite course to one or both majors/minors. Multiple majors/ minors within a department/program	 Multiple majors may not be within the same department or program, except when a department offers separate and dissimilar majors, as approved by the COI. See the <u>list of invalid major/minor combinations</u>. 	Multiple Majors The Minor
Culminating Experience	 The culminating experience must be taken for credit and graded. While departments/programs may make exceptions to their published major/minor requirements as they determine appropriate, an exception to the published major culminating experience must be approved by the Committee on Instruction.
